Modern history and area studies mandatory courses aim to give a broad overview of major topics in contemporary Central European history, culture, politics, and economics, thus providing a solid background for more in-depth study of selected topics in the elective courses where the topics can be discussed in Czech due to the rising language knowledge and skills. Bachelor thesis seminars prepare a student for the selection of the topic of the thesis and provide a guide for writing the thesis.
